GETTING STARTED

- The current pandemic presents us with unprecedented challenges in our academic and personal lives. We recommend you regularly check the [School of Graduate Studies COVID19 update page](#) for the latest university-wide information.
- Clear all admissions conditions** as outlined in your letter of offer. You will be unable to register until this is done. **Official transcripts** from all post-secondary institution you previously attended (including University of Toronto) must be sent directly from the issuing institution to the Graduate Department, Faculty of Music. If your university offers the option of official, electronic transcripts, please choose this option. If only hardcopies are being issued, please send them to 80 Queen's Park, Toronto ON, M5S 2C5. All transcripts must be received no later than **August 31, 2020**.

- Get your [TCard](#) and activate [UTOR e-mail account](#).
- Get to know [ACORN](#), the University of Toronto's web service. You can use it to enroll in courses, access your grades, order transcripts, determine how much you owe on your fees account, update your personal contact information, and much more.
Note: You can access ACORN before setting up your University accounts using your JOINid and password. (*You will need to [enable your JOINid](#) to access the system.*)

REGISTRATION

Registration: Payment or Deferral of Tuition and Fees

- Register on time by **paying or deferring** your tuition and incidental fees. You can review your fees invoice on [ACORN](#) as of **July 20, 2020**. For detailed instructions on how to make a payment or arrange to register without payment, review the [Office of Student Accounts](#) website.
- Registering Without Payment:** Students may register without payment (i.e. make a fee deferral) **if** they have no outstanding fees from a previous session and are the recipient of one of the following which **exceeds** the Minimum Payment to Register amount on your invoice:
 - Government loan
 - University funding package (major award, research stipend or teaching stipend)
- MA/PhD/DMA students may request a deferral through [ACORN](#)
- MMus students receiving funding that **exceeds** the Minimum Payment to Register amount may request a fee deferral by submitting the [Register Without Payment Form](#) to the Graduate Office (Room 143)

NOTE: If you do not register by the deadline (**September 11, 2020**), your enrolment in courses will be **cancelled and further enrolment will be blocked**. If you are registering late, you must contact the SGS Student Services office (graduate.information@utoronto.ca) with proof of payment. Late registration fees will apply.

COURSE ENROLMENT

Course Enrolment: Course Sign Up Opens at 6:00am on July 20, 2020 on ACORN.

- Review and save the [Degree Checklist](#) for your area of study. This document will help you ensure you are enrolled in all your required and elective courses and help you keep track of your progress in the program. *You will use the same checklist for the duration of your degree.*
- Refer to the [Graduate Timetable](#) and [Course Descriptions](#) to start building your timetable. For most students, some mandatory courses will be added for you. Please ensure that all the courses on your record align with the checklist for your area of study and that you **add any missing courses on ACORN**. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure they are properly enrolled in all required and elective courses.

Tips for reading the timetable: F = First term, S = Second term, Y = Full year
Days of the week are indicated by their first letter except for Thursday which is shown as "R"

- Continuous courses are identified with an "0" on in the [Course Descriptions](#). These courses can run over several terms and will remain on your record until a grade is issued. Although you may be automatically enrolled in some of these courses when you begin your program, follow the guidelines on the [Degree Checklist](#) for your area in consultation with your area head to determine when you should be completing the course requirement.
- When selecting elective courses, you may review other music graduate courses for options relevant to your area of study. Please note that some courses are "reserved" for students in that degree program. If you want to take a course outside of your particular area of study and ACORN will not accept your request, contact the course instructor to requesting permission. Bring a [Add/Drop Course](#) with you for them to sign. Bring the signed form to the Graduate Office in room 143.

If you have any questions about which courses are recommended for your program, please contact the Coordinator or Area Chair of your area for advice.

- It may be possible to take an elective outside of the Faculty of Music with approval from your unit head. If you are not able to add the course through ACORN, you must use the SGS [Course Add/Drop Form](#) to enroll. Bring the complete form to the Graduate Office (rm. 143).
- New MMus students with MUS4210H as part of their degree requirements will be required to complete an entrance exam during Orientation Week. Those who pass will receive an exemption from this course. Credits earned through the exemption process must be made up with other course(s) of at least the same credit weight. More details will be sent by email in August.
