Program Highlights

U of T's Comprehensive Studies Program is well suited for students seeking a robustly interdisciplinary experience around a music core; students interested in an area not clearly defined within our existing programs; or students interested in a general program of music studies. The program features a solid, multi-disciplinary core of required courses and offers students the freedom to design part of their program of study around individual interests (for example: Conducting, Ethnomusicology, Music and Health, Music Technology). It is also an ideal option for the student who wants to take advantage of our diverse course offerings. The flexibility of the program makes it advantageous to students wanting to develop significant expertise in a discipline within the Faculty of Arts & Science.

This program will train students to respond to the changing landscape in musical fields by preparing for a diverse set of career paths. The combination of a core music program, with an emphasis on breadth in musical disciplines, highly developed writing skills, and interdisciplinary flexibility best opens up a range of music-related careers, professional programs, and graduate study options. Such areas can include arts administration/ management, music journalism, entertainment law, music and health, and technology.

Program Options

Music and Technology

Electives could include courses such as: Introduction to Computer Applications in Music, Introduction to Music Recording, Live Coding - Digital Audio in Real Time, Max/MSP. Students are able to use their electives towards completing a Music Certificate in Music Technology. the 20 credits required for the

Comprehensive Studies Program. Students may complete a major U of T Music's Comprehensive Studies Program offers maximum flexibility. More than half of the 20 credits required are electives. All required courses are completed during the first two years, giving students the opportunity to choose all of their courses in years 3 and 4.

Beyond Classical & Jazz

Electives could include various courses within Ethnomusicology and Popular Music. In addition, students can participate in a number of ensembles from other traditions as electives. Students are able to use their electives towards completing a Certificate in Popular Music Studies and Ethnomusicology.

Performance

Students in the Comprehensive Studies Program recieve hour-long private lessons and participate in a large ensemble in years 1 and 2, and have the option to continue in years 3 and 4 of the program.
